

Puente la Reina/Gares - Estella/Lizarra

The day begins leaving **Puente de la Reina** through Zubiurrutia, a stretch of 5 kilometres first following the river Arga and then descending to **Mañeru**, the town giving its name to this county of fabulous landscapes and amazing wines.

The next remarkable spot on the route is **Cirauqui**, a medieval town still preserving its old wall and a section of a Roman calzada (road). The river Iguste flows through the town and is traversed by a Roman bridge. Once we leave the town behind, towards the other side of the motorway, a local road passes under the viaduct of the Alloz Canal until the Salado River in its last push towards **Lorca**.

Lying 13 kilometres from where we started, this village offers a break before departing for the second part of the day's itinerary leading from there to Villatuerta, with its Gothic Anunciación church.

A footpath avoids having to walk on the NA-132 and the river Ega leads walkers to the gates of **Estella**, with its church of San Pedro de la Rúa and its Palace of the Kings of Navarre.
